## USDA reminds producers of Feb. 28 deadline for Conservation Reserve Program general signup

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) reminds agricultural producers interested in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) 2020 general signup that the deadline is February 28, 2020. This signup is available to farmers and private landowners who are either enrolling for the first time or re-enrolling for another 10- to 15-year term.

Farmers and ranchers who enroll in CRP receive yearly rental payments for voluntarily establishing long-term, resource-conserving plant species, such as approved grasses or trees (known as "covers"), which can control soil erosion, improve water quality and develop wildlife habitat on marginally productive agricultural lands.

CRP has 22 million acres enrolled, but the 2018 Farm Bill lifted the cap to 27 million acres.

Signed into law in 1985, CRP is one of the largest privatelands conservation programs in the U.S. It was originally intended to primarily control soil erosion and potentially stabilize commodity prices by taking marginal lands out of production. The program has evolved over the years, providing many conservation and economic benefits. Marking its 35th anniversary in 2020, CRP has had many successes, including:

- Preventing more than 9 billion tons of soil from eroding, enough soil to fill 600 million dump trucks;
- Reducing nitrogen and phosphorous runoff relative to annually tilled cropland by 95 and 85 percent respectively;
- Sequestering an annual average of 49 million tons of greenhouse gases, equal to taking 9 million cars off the road;
- Creating more than 3 million acres of restored wetlands while protecting more than 175,000 stream miles with riparian forest and grass buffers, enough to go around the world
- Benefiting bees and other pollinators and increased populations of ducks, pheasants, turkey, bobwhite quail, prairie chickens, grasshopper sparrows and many other birds.

The CRP continuous signup is ongoing, which enables producers to enroll for certain practices. FSA plans to open the Soil Health and Income Protection Program, a CRP pilot program, in early 2020, and the 2020 CRP Grasslands signup runs from March 16 to May 15.



## Restoring forest pollinators presentation to be given at Ivy Tech in Madison

On Monday, March 2, the Big Oaks Conservation Society will hold a meeting at Ivy Tech in Madison, Indiana starting at 6:30PM. Kirsten Carlson a life science adjunct instructor at IVY Tech Community College and a visiting lecturer at Hanover College will do a presentation on Restoring Forest Pollinators. The public is invited to attend this free presentation.

Kirsten Carlson spends much of her time volunteering as an informal conservation educator with an emphasis on pollinators, at various programs and agencies. She and her husband live in Versailles and manage their acreage for multiple usages including farming, classified forest, and pollinator conservation. She loves to help others experience the interconnections that abound in nature.

The program "Restoring Forest Pollinators" examines the dynamics of the physical properties and biological composition of the forest and the ways they impact the population of pollinators. Participants will discover ways to develop habitat for pollinators to call your forest home.

The Big Oaks Conservation Society is the nonprofit support group of the Big Oaks NWR. Society members work closely with refuge staff to enhance public awareness, use, and appreciation for the natural and cultural assets unique to Big Oaks NWR. Meetings are held the first Monday of selected months at 6:30


located in Jennings, Ripley, and Jefferson Counties in southeastern Indiana. The refuge
