OF PLANNED IMPROVEMENT

The City of Batesville in cooperation with The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) is developing plans for a proposed Batesville Community Trail Phase II (INDOT Des. No. 1600748) along parts of W SR 229, N Pohlman St, E Coonhunters Rd and West/East SR 129. The project is located within the Batesville city limits in Ripley County.

The purpose of this proposed project is to provide pedestrians a safe crossing and access to various points of recreation including Brum Woods, Liberty Park, the Sports Complex, the YMCA and the Hillenbrand Business Park in the City of Batesville, Indiana. Another purpose is to connect to other phases of trails to provide a greater trail network throughout the City of Batesville.

The need for the project is based on the lack of pedestrian trails throughout Batesville. There is no pedestrian connection between various points of recreation in the City of Batesville and the existing trail network, which requires pedestrians to use shoulders and travel lanes. Pedestrians are also required to cross railroad tracks on the roadway shoulder and the railroad right-of-way.

The project proposes to construct a 6' wide concrete sidewalk with curb and gutter on the west side of SR 229 (Mulberry St) from the intersection with Central Ave, heading north and tying to the existing sidewalk just north of the railway. This proposed section will connect the northern neighborhoods to the existing trail (Phase I) at Brum Woods.

The project also proposes to construct a 10' asphalt trail beginning at the intersection of Pohlman St and Delaware Rd. The trail will follow the existing gravel trail along the north side of Pohlman St until it turns south and crosses Pohlman St. At that point the trail will follow along the south side of Pohlman St to Coonhunters Rd. The trail will cross Coonhunters Road and proceed north along the east side of the road. The trail will take a turn to the east just south of the railway. It will closely follow a sanitary sewer line. As the trail approaches SR 129 it will turn south along the existing sidewalk on the south side of SR 46.

The proposed construction of this project will require 4.08 acres of new permanent right-of-way and no temporary right-of-way. No relocations or displacements are involved.

The maintenance of traffic (MOT) plan proposes to construct the project with no road closures or detours. Traffic will be maintained during construction. Access to all properties will be maintained throughout construction. School corporations and emergency services will be notified of closures prior to construction should they become necessary. The proposed start of construction is 2021.

The cost associated with this project is approximately \$1.65 million which includes preliminary engineering, right-of-way, and construction with both federal and state funds anticipated to be used. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and INDOT have agreed this project falls within the guidelines of a Categorical Exclusion (CE) Level 2 environmental document. Preliminary design plans along with the CE are available. However, due to the Coronavirus outbreak no public viewing locations will be offered. of Project Located in a Floodplain/Wetland

This is to give notice that the Friendship Regional Sewer District/ Ripley County has conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Order (11988 or 11990) in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 to determine the potential effect that its activity in the (floodplain or wetland) will have on the environment. Friendship RSD has determined that there is not a practicable alternative other than locating the proposed Community Development Block Grant project described below in a floodplain/wetland.

The improvements must be located in a floodplain because the project involves replacing existing control panels for pump stations that were previously constructed in a floodplain. No disturbance is anticipated since the improvements in the floodplain only involve replacing control panels in-kind on previously disturbed ground. The approximate amount of acres effected is very minimal. A few pumps stations are located within the floodplain and they roughly 5 square feet each in size.

of No Significant Impact on the Environment and Notice of Public Request for Release of Funds

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

On or about October 3, 2020 the Ripley County Commissioners on behalf of the Friendship Regional Sewer District will request the release federal funds from the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs (OCRA) for Community Development Block Grant Funds from the State of Indiana under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-383) for the following project:

Friendship RSD Sewer Improvement Project

The project will consist of improvements to the District's wastewater treatment system.

Finding of No Significant Impact

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly the above named, Ripley County has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the Nation Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (P.L. 91-190). The reasons for such decision not to prepare such statement are as follows:

All preliminary environmental reviews by state and county agencies indicated that the proposed project would not endanger the environment under any capacity.

An Environmental Review Record regarding the proposed project has been made by the above named, Ripley County which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available

for public examination and copying upon request at the Ripley County Courthouse, Auditor's office between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday. No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the rquest for release of funds.

Public Comments of Findings

All interested agencies, groups, and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the Ripley County Commissioners to the Ripley County Courthouse, 115 N Main St., Versailles, IN 47042. Such written comments should be received by October 2, 2020. All such comments so received will be considered and Ripley County will not request the release of federal funds or take any administrative action on the proposed project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentences.

Release of Funds

Ripley County will undertake the project described above with Community Development Block Grant funds from the State of Indiana under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. Ripley County is certifying to the State that Ripley County and Mark Horstman in his official capacity as Commissioner President consents to accept the jurisdiction of the federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval Ripley County may use the Block Grant funds and the State will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969.

Objections to State Release of Funds

The State will accept an objection to its approval only if it is on one of the following bases: (a) that the certification was not in fact executed by the certifying officer or other officer of applicant approved by the State; or (b) that the applicant's environmental review record for the project indicated omission of a required review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (24 CFR Part 58) and may be addressed to the OCRA, Environmental Specialist, One North Capitol, Suite 600, Indianapolis, Indiana 46204-2288.

Objections to the release of funds on basis other than those stated above will not be considered by the State. No objections received after October 19, 2020 will be considered by the State.
