Recipe Corner

Prize-Winning Quick Pickled Vegetables

As more produce comes into season, it’s the perfect time to try out a new recipe with locally grown ingredients available at area farmers markets.

Cheryl Greiner, owner of Pat’s Bulk Food in Versailles, said she’s tried this recipe for quick pickled vegetables already this year. She said it’s simple to make and can be refrigerated for up to a week for your family to enjoy throughout the week after just one prep session in the kitchen.



- Ingredients
- 1 package Mrs. Wages Kosher Dill Pickle Mix
 - 7 1/3 cups water
 - 1/2 tsp. red pepper flakes
 - 3 peeled garlic cloves, sliced
 - 3 lbs. frozen California Blend vegetables or an equal amount of frozen broccoli florets, cauliflower and sliced carrots
 - 1 lb. bag frozen pearl onions or one purple onion cut in chunks
 - 1 sweet pepper – red, orange or green
 - 1 stalk celery
 - 1 1/2 cups white vinegar
 - 1 3/4 cups cider vinegar
- Directions
- Remove veggies from the freezer and place in a large bowl.
 - Cut peppers and celery into chunks & add to vegetables along with pearl onions. Toss vegetables to mix. Heat Mrs. Wages mix, water and vinegar to a boil over medium heat.
 - Add 1/2 teaspoon red pepper flakes and sliced garlic. Ladle hot liquid over the veggies and stir well. Cover the bowl with clear wrap or foil. Let rest at room temperature for 20 minutes, stir again and then refrigerate. Wait 2-3 hours before serving chilled.
