Lady Eagles are again the favorite

Jac-Cen-Del girls basketball has watched a couple of fellow Class A Sectional 60 opponents reign supreme over the past two years but now the Lady Eagles are the favorites to once again bring home a sectional championship to Osgood.

The Lady Eagles have won 25 sectional championships -fifth-best in the state- and are in the driver's seat as Sectional 60 favorites, entering the final week of the regular season with an overall record of 11-10 which includes a five-game win streak and chance at an Ohio River Valley Conference championship. Only Morristown (10-10) and Oldenburg Academy (9-9) are current postseason foes with a record of .500 or better while Waldron and Southwestern (Shelby), the two previous defending champions, are just 4-16 and 5-15 respectively.

Jac-Cen-Del is unblemished against sectional opponents this year with a mark of 5-0 and the five wins have come by an average margin of 22.4 points per game. Only Oldenburg, who lost 57-47 on November 18, has come within 10 points or less of the Lady Eagles. As impressive as the defense has been in terms of allowing low point totals and creating turnovers, it is Jac-Cen-Del's offense that is currently red hot and has paced their recent five-game win streak. After a four-game losing skid that saw the Osgood crew score just 50-plus points on one occasion, the Lady Eagles in their last five contests are averaging 57.6 points per game and three players are averaging double figures.

Reagan Hughes (13.1 ppg), Julia Meyer (13.0 ppg, 6.8 rpg, 3.4 apg) and Olivia Neal (10.0 ppg, 6.0 rpg) are spearheading the effort while Kelsey Borgman at 7.6 points per night has come on as of late and provided another scoring threat.

Jac-Cen-Del opens Sectional 60 next Tuesday night at Southwestern (Shelby) against defending champion Waldron who made a run to the Class A Final Four a year ago. The winner meets the host Lady Spartans in the first semifinal game on Friday night.

Lady Indians prepare for sectional run

Milan girls basketball has not won a game inside Class 2A Sectional 45 since 2019 but after receiving a bye to the semifinals this season against an opponent it can compete with, the Lady Indians just may have the opportunity to sneak into next week's championship game.

The Lady Indians were sectional runner-up in 2018 and plays Hauser (9-9) next Friday night in the semifinal round with a title game berth on the line. Milan fell to the Lady Jets 48-33 all the way back on November 10 but it was a game in which one bad second quarter ruined a matchup in which the black and gold owned an advantage in the three other quarters combined.

Tournament success has been tasted by Milan already this season, having won the Cambridge

City Classic on December 29 but a downward spiral has been trending ever since. The Lady Indians entered this week with a 3-17 overall record and has suffered through a five-game losing streak that dates back to after that tourney. In their defense, the schedule in that stretch has been brutal considering four of the five foes -South Ripley, Jac-Cen-Del, Shawe Memorial and North Decatur- own winning records while the other loss, to Rising Sun, was against a Lady Shiner ball club that has hovered around the .500 mark all season. So how exactly can the Lady Indians get a victory when wins matter the most? A lot of it will have to do with the offense. Yes, turnovers are a big issue for an inexperienced roster but points have to be put up and such a statement has evidence behind it. Milan is only

Should they score and take care of the basketball, that will in return limit possessions by the opponent and make Friday night's sectional title an interesting contest. The freshmen duo of Kaiya Rinear and Emma Voss will be relied upon heavily to produce that kind of offense. Rinear is a double-double machine at 12.6 points per game and 11.8 rebounds per game while Voss is averaging just under double figures and has connected on 24 made 3-pointers. A third scorer could ease the load and that perhaps comes in the form of Anna Herzog who continues to improve as the year goes along.

The Friday night game against Hauser will be the first semifinal played that night at Switzerland County.

It has been 17 long years since Oldenburg Academy has won a Class A Sectional 60 championship but with the right draw in place, the Lady Twisters feel they are a contender in the tournament come next week.

Not that the road to a title game won't be a challenge because it will. However, Oldenburg is 2-1 against opponents that stand in its way of that goal. Their opening round matchup against South Decatur (7-12) is a rematch from a game that saw the Lady Twisters win 42-30 on December 3 while also having beat potential semifinal foe Edinburgh 41-29 on November 29. The only loss on that side of the bracket has been to Morristown as the Yellow Jackets won the regular season collision 36-32 on December 12. Oldenburg's only other loss to a Sectional 60 team was the 10-point loss to Jac-Cen-Del. A potential rematch between those two would come in the championship game next Saturday night. With a 9-9 record going into this week, the Lady Twisters have had some impressive victories which includes wins over Rising Sun, Franklin County and Hauser. Oldenburg coming into the final week of the regular season was on a two-game skid but those losses were chalked up to Class A No. 1 Tri and Providence who is 14-6 and considered a favorite in Class 2A Sectional 46. It is worth noting that in the nine wins, Oldenburg's offense is only averaging 43 points per game but the defense has been stifling, only allowing 32.4 points in those same contests. Overall on the year it is an offense scoring just 39 points per game but again defense has made
