their all



Memorial Day is about remembering those who gave their all for our freedom. The 13th Annual Ride to Remember does just that - reflect and remember.

The Indiana Patriot Guard (IPG) will be traveling 300 plus miles through southeast Indiana honoring 16 Soldiers and Marines with ties to the area. The ride will take place over two days - June 10 and June 11, starting in Batesville Saturday morning and ending in Versailles on Sunday afternoon. This group will be keeping their promise to Never Forget. They will speak the names aloud to keep their memory alive.

At each of the stops along the route a service is conducted. It will last about 25 minutes at each place.

At most of the stops along the way members of Gold Star families will be there. "We encourage everyone to join us at a single service, or for any portion of the ride. Attendeees do not need to be Veterans, nor do they need to ride a motorcycle. We normally have many vehicles that join us for portions of the ride," noted Michael Buettner, who works with organizing the ride. He further said, "For those that

couldn't show support when our Fallen Hero was brought home, this is a great time to show the Gold Star families that they are remembered."

Sgt. Chad Keith of Batesville, will be remembered at the first stop for his sacrifice 20 years ago.

There is no cost for anyone to attend and join in the ride. "All we ask is that attendees show honor and respect, all attendees are invited to participate in the flag line at each stop," Buettner said.
