AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 73

WHEREAS, the Town Council of Milan, Indiana, has previously adopted Ordinances regulating parking, and

WHEREAS, the Town Council desires to create no parking areas on Mill Road and Carr Street.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF MILAN, INDIANA:

Section 1. That Chapter 73 of the Town Code of Ordinances be amended by adding the following:

W. Carr - north side	Only 15 minute parking during business hours allowed in front of Gas Company, Post Office	8-12-2024-1	
W. Carr - north side	No Parking 100' from intersection of W. Carr and Josephine	8-12-2024-1	

Penalty, see § 70.99

Section 2. That the amendment be effective upon publication.

Indiana State parks seeks input with new survey

What do you think about Indiana State Parks?

The Indiana Department of Natural Resources (DNR) wants your feedback on your favorite activities and priorities for management of state parks.

"Indiana State Parks belong to all of us as Hoosiers," said Ginger Murphy, deputy director for stewardship for Indiana State Parks. "We continue to look to the future and want ideas and thoughts from Hoosiers about their interests and priorities for our parks. We really appreciate all who take the time to complete the survey."

The survey is available at dnr.IN.gov/state-parks/about-us/whats-new and will be open for completion through Dec. 1. It should take about 10-15 minutes to complete.

DNR conducted a similar survey five years

ago. Survey results will be used to help DNR plan future facilities and services at Indiana State Parks.

Questions ask guests to rate service, value, and facilities at state park properties and inns. The survey also asks users where they would like Indiana State Parks to devote future resources. Those who don't visit Indiana State Park properties are also offered ways to respond in the survey.

Participants will be eligible for drawings for 2025 annual entrance passes, camping gift cards, and inns gift cards.

Indiana State Parks manages 36 properties, including 24 state parks, eight state reservoirs, two state forest recreation areas, and two off-road state recreation areas. State Park Inns, which are part of the survey, are located at seven state park properties.

DNR to stock channel catfish statewide

The Indiana Department of Natural Resources (DNR) will stock 157 locations with approximately 51,000 catfish this fall to expand angling opportunities across the state.

All stocked channel catfish will be stocked in publicly accessible waters after being raised by state biologists at Cikana Fish Hatchery in Morgan County, Driftwood Fish Hatchery in Jackson County, and East Fork Fish Hatchery in Daviess County. All stocking locations should receive catfish by early November, with quantities subject to change due to production variables.

These catfish range in size from 8-10 inches long. "Once stocked, they acclimate to their new environment quickly, they shouldn't take long to start biting," said fisheries biologist Dave Kittaka.

Anglers are required to follow bag and size restrictions. In most lakes and reservoirs, the statewide regulation is 10 channel catfish per day with no more than one being longer than 28 inches. A few lakes have a different bag limit, and they are listed in the Fishing Guide, as well as at eregulations.com/indiana/fishing/basic-fishing-information under Special Regulations Waters.

All channel catfish stocking locations and estimated numbers are listed, subject to change, at on.IN.gov/fish-stocking.

DNR offers gift packs

Cross those hard-to-buy-for people off your shopping list in a snap by giving them a 2025 holiday gift pack from the Indiana Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Salomonie

The gift packs, with only a limited quantity available, can be used the whole year, whether the recipient enjoys camping under the stars or sleeping in the comfort of an Indiana State Park Inn after enjoying the outdoors. The gift pack also saves you as much as \$27 compared with buying the items individually.

A gift pack includes a 2025 resident annual entrance pass, a one-year subscription to Outdoor Indiana magazine, and one of two \$65 gift card options. One gift card option can be used at the campgrounds. Another gift card option is a \$65 State Park Inns gift card. You also have the option of upgrading either to \$100 by paying \$35 more.

Indiana has 36 state park properties throughout the state. The annual entrance pass grants gate entrance (a carload) for 2025 to all state park properties beginning Jan. 1.

The inns gift card can be used at any State Park Inn, as well as at the award-winning Pete Dye-designed golf course at Fort Harrison State Park in Indianapolis. The card can also be used for lodging, meals in the inns dining rooms, or gift purchases.

The camping gift card may also be used to purchase daily entrance, lake permits, horse tags, and any other items sold at gatehouses and park-operated stores and gift shops. The camping gift card cannot be used at any privately operated concessions, camp stores, marinas, or saddle barns.

The offer is available through Dec. 31, 2024, or when sold out. Gift packs can be purchased only at shopINStateParks.com.

Test Smoke Alarms

As the colder months approach, many of us start using space heaters, holiday lights, and fireplaces. This increase in electrical and heating activity makes it especially important to ensure your home or office is safe from fire hazards.

- Regularly test your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, especially during the colder months when heating equipment is in use.
- Replace batteries at least once a year and replace the entire unit every 10 years for maximum safety.
- Ensure smoke alarms are installed and tested in all areas of the building, including attics, basements, and crawl spaces, where fires can sometimes start unnoticed.
