David W. Mortara, PhD, is the founder and president of Mortara Instrument, a medical technology company based in Milwaukee, Wisconsin which designs, manufactures, and distributes equipment worldwide. He is a leader in the field of electrocardiography and over the course of his career has made significant contributions to cardiology. After graduating from Milan High School in 1958 he received a BS from Purdue University and a PhD in Physics from University of Illinois. Dr. Mortara attributes much of his success to the Milan High School community,
